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### E-Safety

During their class assemblies this week, the children have looked again at important e-safety messages. The children focused on our SMART rules. These rules explain what is meant by "personal information" and how to protect that information, for example by not sharing it with other people online. The children also discussed the age restrictions for apps and online games.

To help support this work at home, please check that your children only access age-appropriate websites, apps and games. Please also make sure that their privacy settings are set to private. The age ratings for popular apps and games are as follows: Roblox: (7+), Snapchat (13+), Tik Tok (13+), Twitch (13+), WhatsApp (16+), Facebook (13+), Instagram (13+), YouTube (13+).

We will continue to teach our children about staying safe online during their computing lessons and their relationships and health sessions.
